Criteria For Neuropsychological Testing

Successful completion of systematic didactic and experiential training in neuropsychology and neuroscience at a regionally accredited University including:

- 1. <u>Coursework</u> (documented by official transcript in the following areas) or certification recognized by the American Board of Clinical Neuropsychology (ABCN) or the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN) or eligible to sit for board certification(within six-years of completing an approved fellowship program) :
 - Neuroanatomy
 - Clinical Neuropsychology (adult and/or pediatric courses)
 - Basic Neuroscience
 - Clinical Neurology
 - Clinical Psychopathology
 - Psychopharmacology
 - Clinical Assessment Techniques (1 year)
- 2. <u>Experiential Training</u>: Two or more years of appropriate, supervised training applying to neuropsychological services in a clinical setting consisting of practicum and internship components.
- 3. Licensing and certification to provide psychological services to the public by the laws of the state or province in which they practice.
- 4. Review and documentation by neuropsychologists attesting to these competencies.
